

South Euclid-Lyndhurst Historical Society Call for Essays

It's time to tell the story of your place in South Euclid. To mark the hundredth anniversary of the city's incorporation, the South Euclid-Lyndhurst Historical Society, in cooperation with the Centennial Committee of the City of South Euclid, One South Euclid, and the Notre Dame College English Department, is seeking short essays capturing all aspects of life in this community.

Tell us the story of your family's business, or the place your company has in the broader business community. For instance, is your restaurant the successor to earlier restaurants on the site or on the block?

Tell us the story of your church or synagogue, when it opened its doors to the people of this area and how it continues to meet the needs of today's community.

Tell us how your block or neighborhood was developed from open fields to the residential community it is today.

Tell us about your Garden Club, your Scout troop, your bowling league, your service club, your school's PTO.

Tell us if yours is a centennial family who has lived continuously in the city since 1917. Perhaps there is a "favorite son/daughter" whose contributions deserve wider recognition.

These short essays (approximately 750-3,000 words) must be submitted by February 1, 2017 for editing and to be considered for inclusion in the centennial publication. The essays need not be masterpieces of creative writing, or utterly free of structural errors. (Essays that need a little work make our editors feel needed!)
